Framework for Open Data Technical Support

Under Ireland's Open Data Initiative and as set out in Ireland's <u>Open Data Strategy 2017-2022</u> launched on July 14th 2017 following Government approval, public bodies are to identify and publish appropriate datasets on the web as Open Data which can be linked to the national Open Data Portal at <u>data.gov.ie</u>. The Initiative aims to create an environment where, by opening up Government data, new opportunities for research, innovation, transparency, engagement and greater efficiency are delivered and realised by all.

The Department of Public Expenditure and Reform, following a procurement process on behalf of the wider Public Service, has commissioned a **Multi-Supplier Framework for the Provision of Technical Assistance and Support on the Implementation of Ireland's Open Data Initiative** for Public bodies in Ireland. This includes technical assistance and support for the following aspects of Open Data:

- Open Data Management
- Auditing data
- Data publishing
- Linking data
- Use Case analysis
- Data analytics
- Development of visualisation tools and visualisation applications

The framework agreement will be divided into two lots as described below:

Accessing services covered by this framework is via Mini-Competition

There are a number of stages you must go through in order to run a Mini-Competition (the User Guide provides further information on the steps below):

- 1. Define Specification: Firstly, you must be clear about what you actually require and which Lot is applicable
- **2.** Choose Evaluation Criteria: The award criteria for Mini-Competitions shall be by MEAT (Most Economically Advantageous Tender) in terms of Quality and Cost Ratio
- **3.** Supplementary Request for Tender Form Preparation: Once the services and Lot has been identified the Client shall populate the Supplementary Request for Tender Form

Who can access this Framework?

The following entities (each a "Framework Client") may award (or "call off") contracts (each a "Services Contract") under the Framework Agreement in accordance with the rules set out in the form of Framework Agreement set out at Appendix 6. The Contracting Authority is also a Framework Client.

- Ministers of the Government of Ireland, Central Government Departments, Offices and non-commercial Agencies and Organisations which have a formal reporting and legal relationship to Central Government Departments, including all local authorities in Ireland (themselves including regional assemblies, local enterprise boards and library bodies)
- Contracting authorities in the Irish health sector including but not limited to the Health Service Executive (HSE); the Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA) and HSE funded Agencies delivering health & personal social services funded by more than 50% from Exchequer funds

- 3. Contracting authorities which are Third Level Educational Institutions (including universities, institutes of technology and members of the Education Procurement Service)
- 4. Contracting authorities which are Education and Training Boards (ETBs) and ETB schools, and primary, post-primary, special and secondary schools as well as ETBs acting on behalf of schools
- 5. An Garda Síochána (Police)
- 6. The Irish Prison Service
- 7. The Defence Forces
